Monthly Report

OCTOBER 2014

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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

CRIME ANALYSIS




The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Office is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, by administration for improved staffing decisions, and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

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TOTAL CRIME

The crime activity for the month of October 2014 was at a total of 1,391 NIBRIS reportable offenses, a -4% decrease, comparing to the total of offenses reported in October of the last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 71,527, the crime rate in October of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, comparing to 21 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, a -5% decrease. As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 50%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 698$). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 34% of all the crimes ($n = 475$). Following in third and fourth places are, respectively, Crimes of Proactive Policing, comprising of 13% ($n = 182$) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 3% ($n = 36$) of all the crimes this month.

1,000 population, as compared to 215 offenses per 1,000 population last year, a -3% decrease. To date, a 54% of all the offenses is attributed to Other Crimes category ($n = 7,904$). Property Crimes amount to 31% of all the offenses ($n = 4,533$), Crimes of Proactive Policing comprise of 13% of all the crimes to date, where $n = 1,871$; Crimes against Persons comprise of 2% of a total year to date number of crimes ($n = 293$).






Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through October 2014. A total of 14,601 NIBRIS reportable offenses were reported so far in 2014, a -3% decrease, comparing to the same period of last year. The year to date crime rate is 208 offenses per

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CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS


There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 36 offenses in this area in October this year, 6 offenses less, comparing to October of the last year (-20%). There were 6 more Robberies reported this year in October,

comparing to the last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, there are no significant changes in frequencies for the remaining offenses under this category.



A graph below shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons, which amounts to a total of 293 offenses for this category of crimes, a 2% increase, comparing to the year to date data of last year. Robberies decreased by -10%. There were 12 less instances of Forcible Fondling, comparing to the same time frame

last year. There were 3 more Murders and Nonnegligent Manslaughters committed this year. Aggravated Assaults have increased by 12% and we had 8 more instances of Forcible Sodomy reported so far this year. There are no other significant changes in frequencies for the crimes in this category.




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PROPERTY CRIMES


This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 475 Property Crimes, a -2% decrease, comparing to October of the last year. The data indicates change in

Burglary/Breaking & Entering, down -14%, and in the Shoplifting is down, -19%. No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.



To date, a total of 4,533 property offenses have been reported, a -4% decrease, comparing to the last year's data at this same time. The following changes are noted this year to date period: Burglary /Breaking & Entering are down, -36%; Theft from Building is down, -8%; Motor Vehicle Theft is down, -18%; Counterfeiting /

Forgery is down, -10%; False Pretenses / Swindle/ Confidence Game are down, -45%; Stolen Property Offenses are down, -9%, and Bad Checks offenses are down, -61%. Theft from Motor Vehicle is up 55%, Credit Card/ATM Fraud is up 25%, and All Other Larceny is up 5%.




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CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING


Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 182 offenses have been reported this month, down -19%,

comparing to October of the last year. Drug/Narcotic Violations have increased by 15%. Driving Under the Influence violations are down, -34%; Drunkenness is down -40%. There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.



To date for the year 2014, there have been 1,871 offenses of proactive policing reported, a -13% decrease when comparing to the last year's to date data. Drug/Narcotic Violations are down -6%, Drug / Equipment Violations are down -7%, Weapon Law Violations are down -28%, Driving Under Influence has decreased by

-29%. Drunkenness is down -20% and Liquor Law Violations are down -51%, and there were 9 less incidents of Pornography / Obscene Material offenses reported to date this year. Trespass of Real Property has increased by 11%. There are no other significant changes noted for other offenses in this category.



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OTHER CRIMES


There are 21 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 698 Other Crimes reported, a -1% decrease, comparing to October of the last year. All Other Offenses have decreased by -2%.

Simple Assaults have decreased by -13% while Intimidation offenses have increased by 22%. No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.



To date this year, there have been 7,904 Other Crimes offenses reported, down -1% when comparing to the last year's to date data. Intimidation offenses have increased by 11% and Simple Assaults offenses have decreased by

-8%. Runaway offenses are down, -24%. All Other Offenses have decreased by -1%. No other major changes have been observed for other offenses within this category, comparing to the last year's data.







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ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In October 2014, there were a total of 696 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department, down -21%, comparing with the last year’s data for the month of October. The rate of arrests per offense has decreased by -18% this month, comparing to the rate from the previous year; the rate of arrests per offense since January through October have decreased by -1%. This section breaks down this month’s

arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 65%, have been male ($n = 451$), as opposed to 35% of female arrestees ($n = 245$). As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (53%) and African American (42%), comparing to Hispanic (4%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%).




Caucasian males make up the majority, a 32% of arrestees this month, followed by African American males, 29%. Caucasian females make up 21% , while African American females make

up 13% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 3%, while Hispanic females make up less than 1%.

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EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible

for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and

work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

TRAFFIC



The Traffic Enforcement Unit responds to traffic accidents and provides increased enforcement in particularly challenging areas. This unit also provides extra coverage for specific congestion
