

# JONESBORO POLICE DEPARTMENT

## Monthly Report

### MARCH 2014

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*The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Parking Enforcement, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.*

#### **CRIME ANALYSIS**

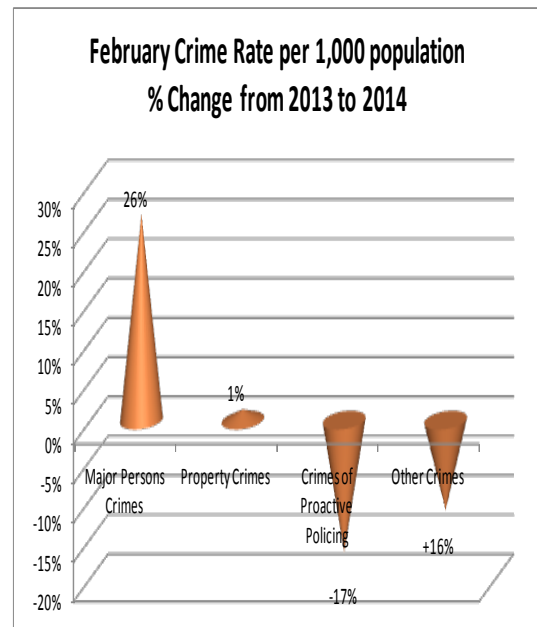
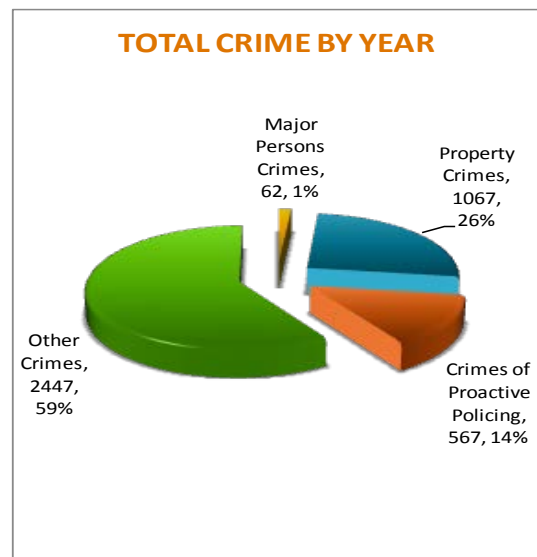
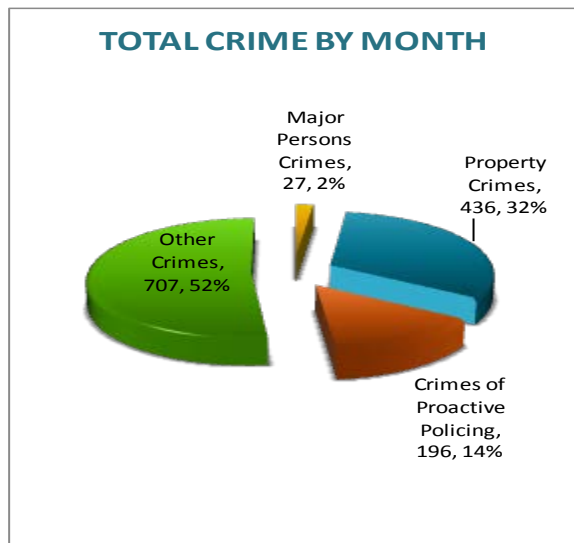
The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Office is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps, presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest, and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, by administration for improved staffing decisions, and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

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**TOTAL CRIME**

The crime activity for the month of March 2014 was at a total of 1,366 NIBRIS reportable offenses, a -6% decrease, comparing to the total of offenses reported in March of the last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 71,527, the crime rate in March of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, comparing to 21 crimes per 1,000 population last year<sup>1</sup>, a -8% decrease. As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 52%, of this month's crime activity ( $n = 707$ ). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 32% of all the crimes ( $n = 436$ ). Following in third and fourth places are, respectively, Crimes of Proactive Policing, comprising of 14% ( $n = 196$ ) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 2% ( $n = 27$ ) of all the crimes this month.

per 1,000 population was 59, as compared to 60 crimes per 1,000 population last year, a -2% decrease. To date, a 59% of all the crimes is attributed to Other Crimes category ( $n = 2,447$ ). Property Crimes amount to 26% of all the crimes ( $n = 1,067$ ), Crimes of Proactive Policing comprise of 14% of all the crimes to date, where  $n = 567$ ; Crimes against Persons comprise of 1% of a total year to date number of crimes ( $n = 62$ ).



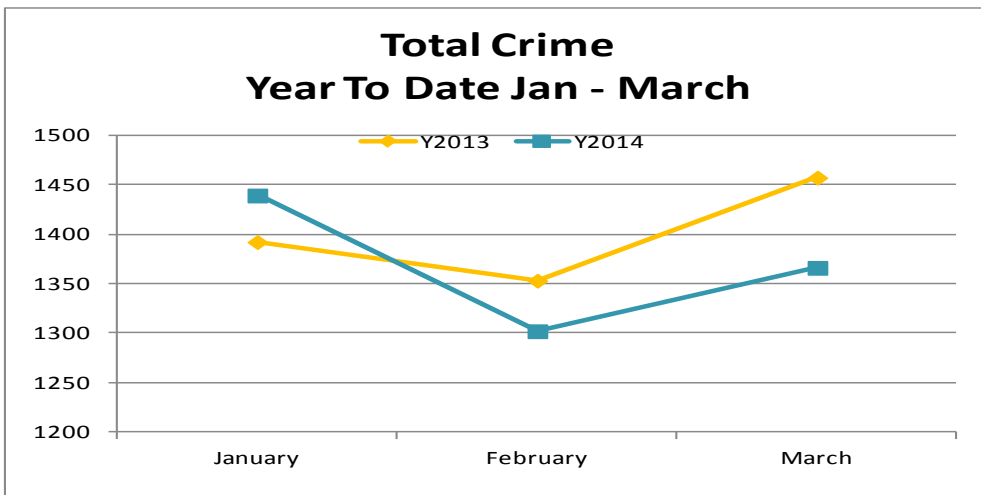
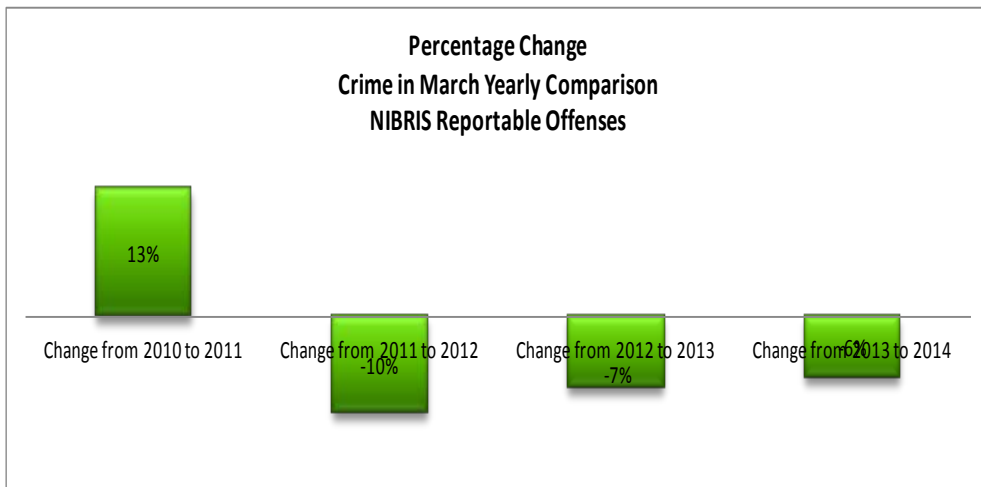
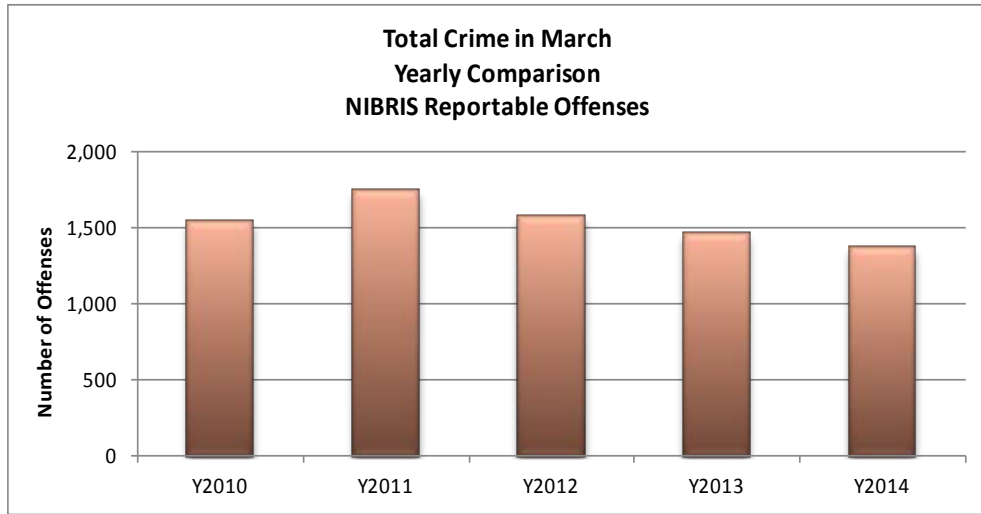
Year to date data includes number of crimes from January through March 2014. A total of 4,143 NIBRIS reportable offenses were reported in 2014, a -2% decrease, comparing to the same period of last year. The year to date crime rate

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The charts below depict frequencies of crime by year, percentage change from year to year, and year to date yearly comparison.

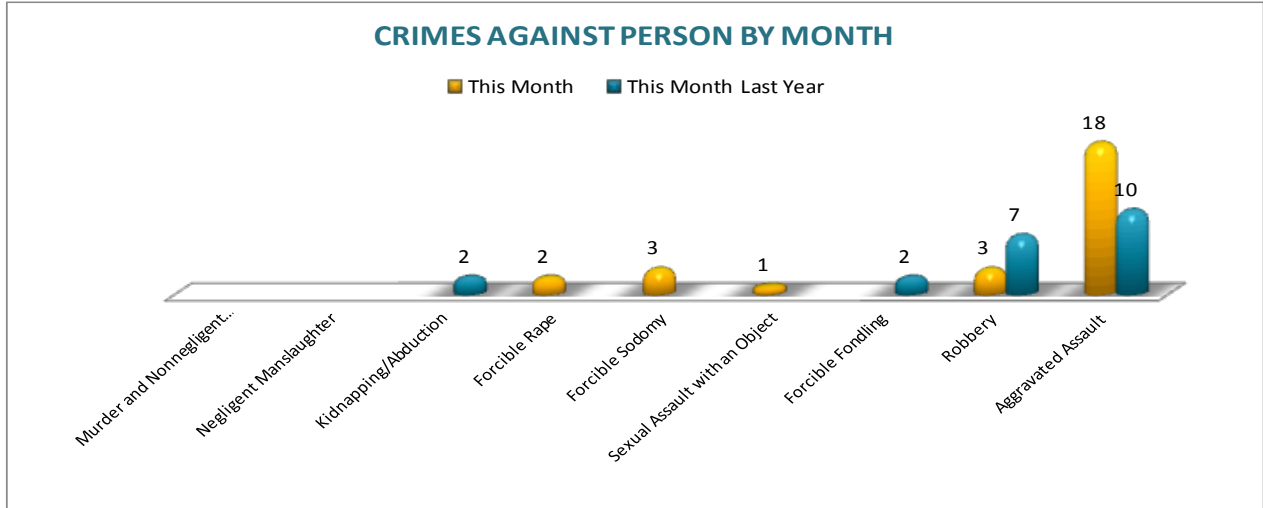


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### CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

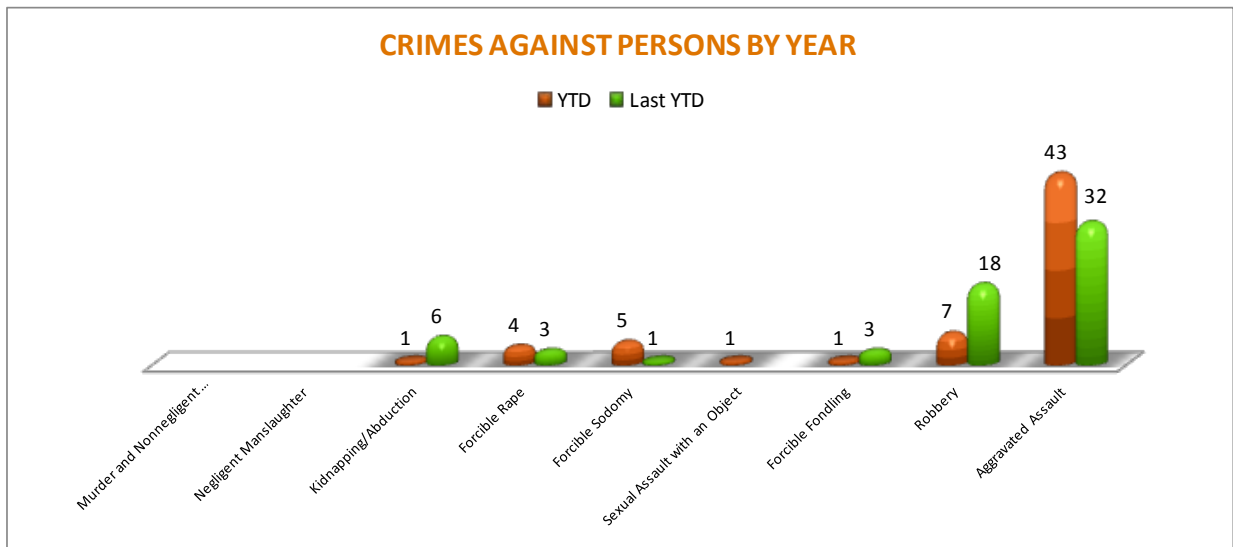
There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 27 offenses in this area in March this year, 6 offenses more, comparing to March of the last year. There were 8 more

Aggravated Assaults than last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, there are no significant changes in frequencies for the crimes in this category.



A graph below shows the year to date data for Crimes against Persons, which amounts to a total of 62 offenses for this category of crimes, a -2% decrease, comparing to the year to date

data of last year. Aggravated Assaults have increased by 34%, but Robberies decreased by -61%. There are no other significant changes in frequencies for the crimes in this category.

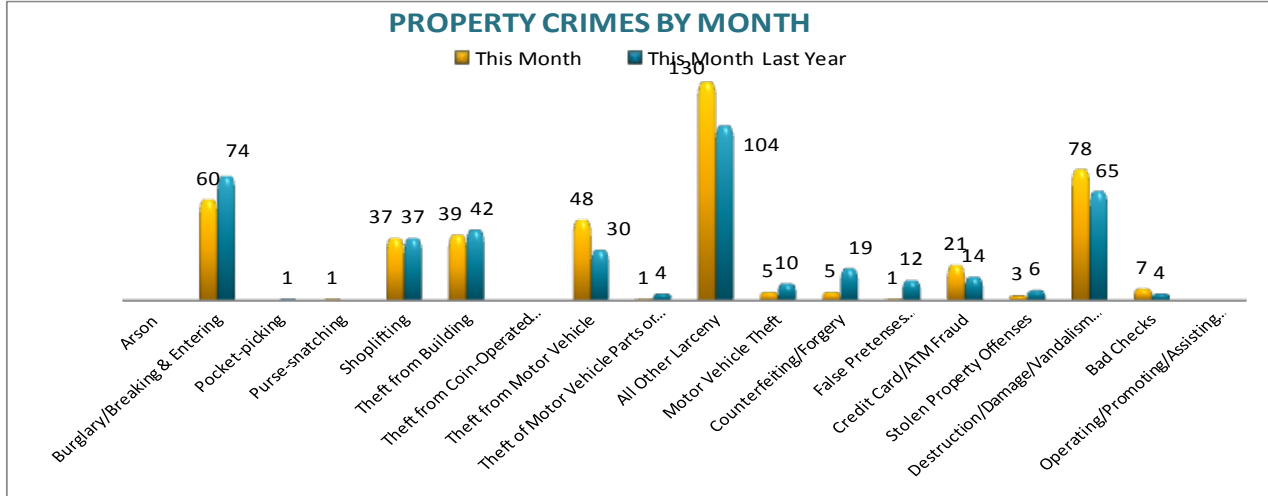


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**PROPERTY CRIMES**

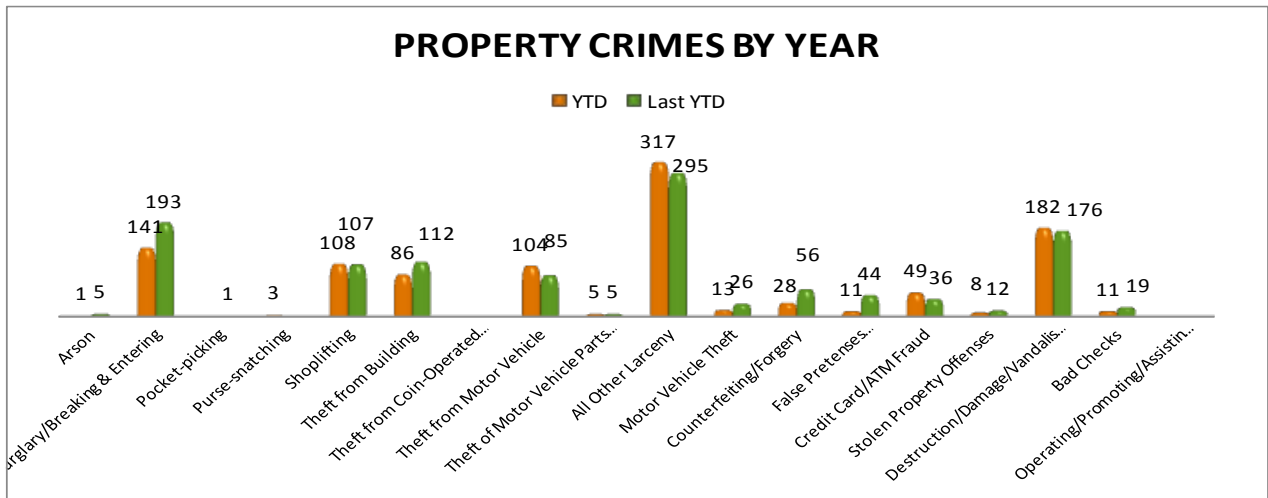
This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 436 Property Crimes, a 3% increase, comparing to March of the last year. The data indicates change in Burglary/Breaking & Entering, down -19%, Theft from Building is

down -7%, Counterfeiting / Forgery is down -74%, and False Pretenses /Swindle/Confidence Game are down 92%, comparing to March of last year. Theft from Motor Vehicle is up 60%, All Other Larceny is up 25%, and Destruction / Damage / Vandalism has an increase of 20%.



To date, a total of 1,067 property offenses have been reported, a -9% decrease, comparing to the last year's data at this same time. The following changes are noted this year: Burglary /Breaking & Entering is down, -27%; Theft from Building is down, -23%, Motor Vehicle Theft is down, -50%; Counterfeiting/Forgery is down -50%; and False Pretenses / Swindle/ Confidence

Game is down -75%. Destruction / Damage/ Vandalism of Property have an increase of 3%, Theft from Motor Vehicle is up 22%, Credit Card/ATM Fraud is up 36%, and All Other Larceny is up 7%; There are no other significant changes noted for other offenses in this category.

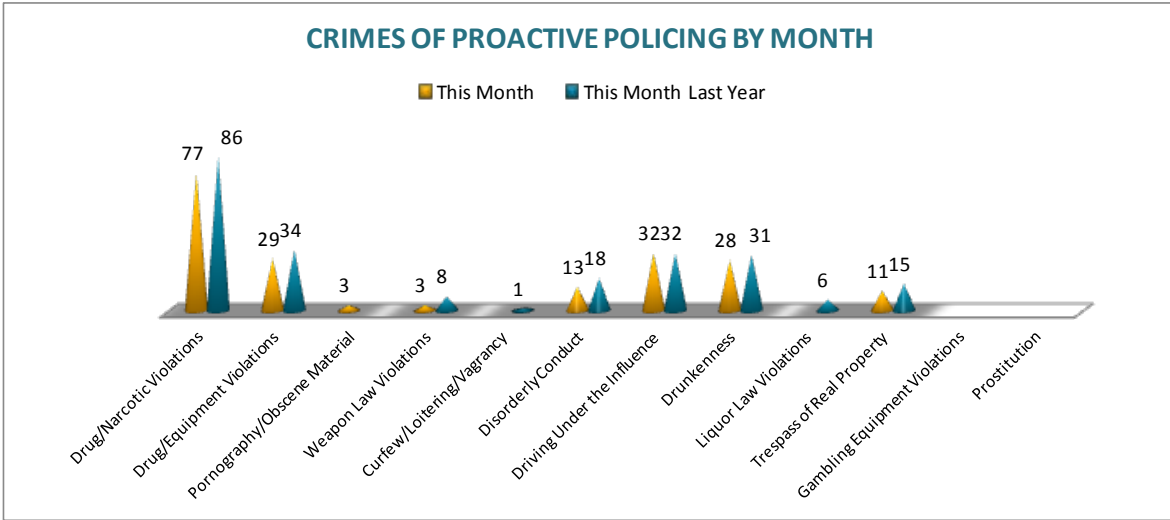


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### CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

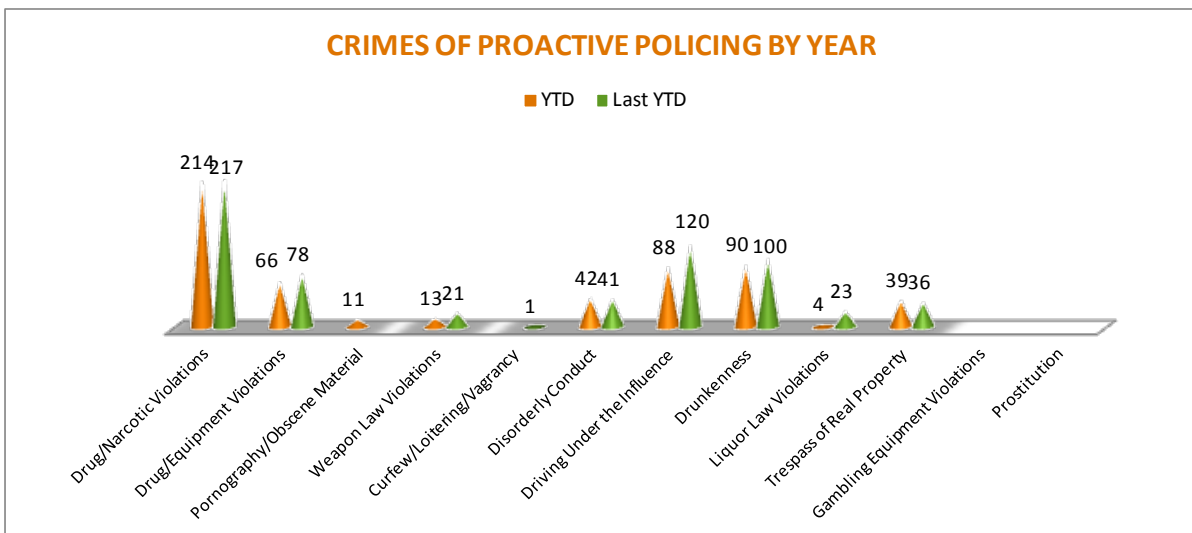
Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 196 offenses have been reported this month, down -15%,

comparing to March of the last year. Drug/Narcotic Violations have decreased by -10% and so did Drug/Equipment Violations, down 15%. There are no other significant changes noted for the offenses in this category.



To date for the year 2014, there have been 567 crimes of proactive policing reported, an -11% decrease when comparing to the last year's to date data. Drug/Equipment Violations are down -15%, Weapon Law Violations are down -38%,

Driving under Influence is down has decreased by 27%, Drunkenness by -10%, and Liquor Law Violations are by -83%. There are no other significant changes noted for other offenses in this category.

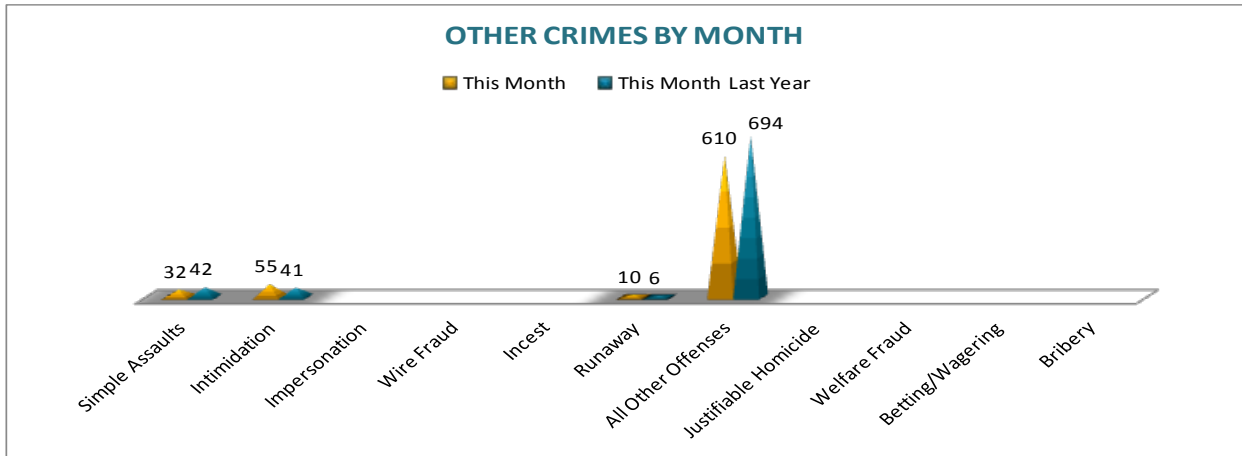


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## OTHER CRIMES

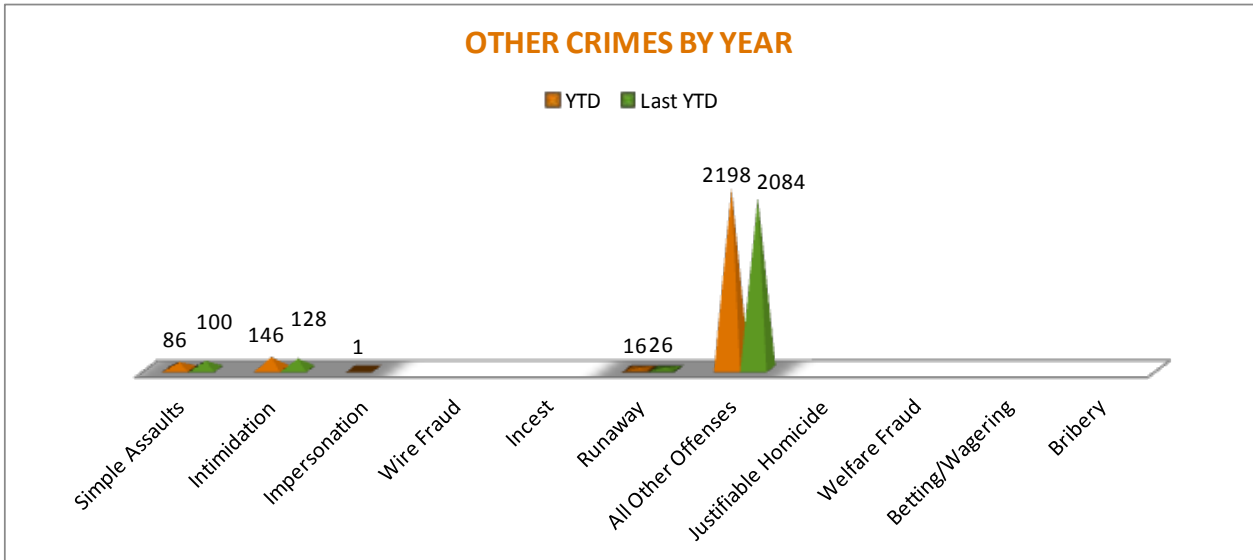
There are 11 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 707 Other Crimes reported, a -10% decrease, comparing to March of the last year. Simple Assaults are down -24% while All Other

Offenses have decreased by 12%. Intimidation has increased by 34%. No other significant changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.



To date this year, there have been 2,447 Other Crimes offenses reported, a 5% increase, comparing to the last year's to date data. While Intimidation offenses have increased by 14%, the Simple Assaults decreased by -14%. All

Other Offenses have increased by 5%. No other significant changes have been observed for other offenses within this category, comparing to the last year's data.

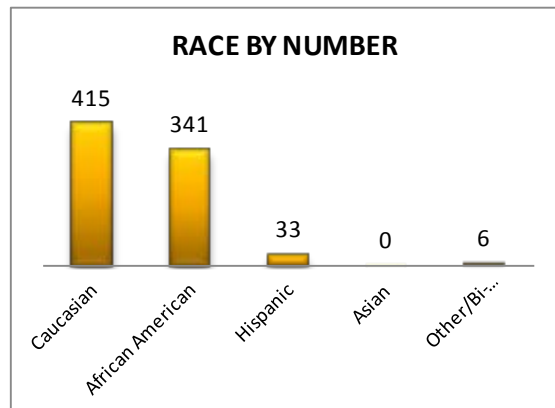
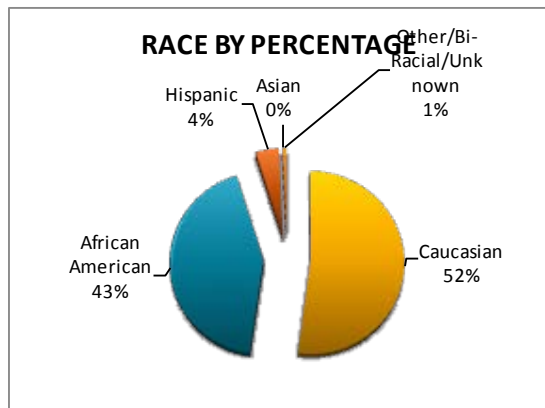
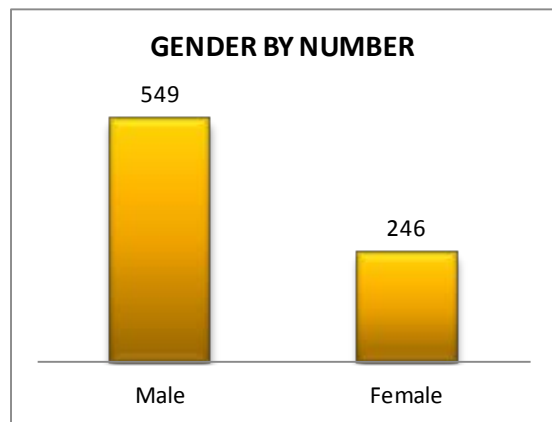
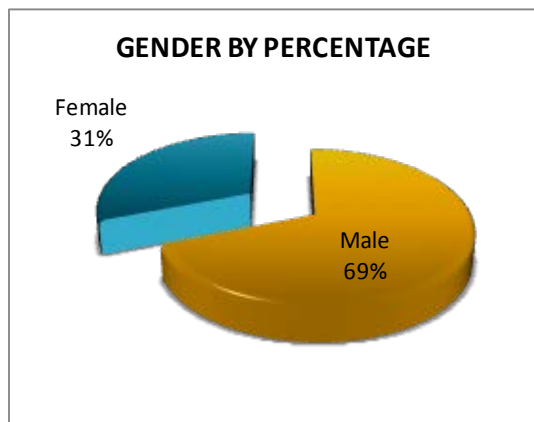


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## ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In March 2014, there were a total of 795 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department, down -7%, comparing with the last year's data for the month of March. The rate of arrests per offense has decreased by -1% this month, comparing to the rate from the previous year, while the rate of arrests per offense since January through March have increased by +4%. This section breaks down this month's arrests

by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 69%, have been male ( $n = 549$ ), as opposed to 31% of female arrestees ( $n = 246$ ). As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (52%) and African American (43%), as opposed to Hispanic (4%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%).



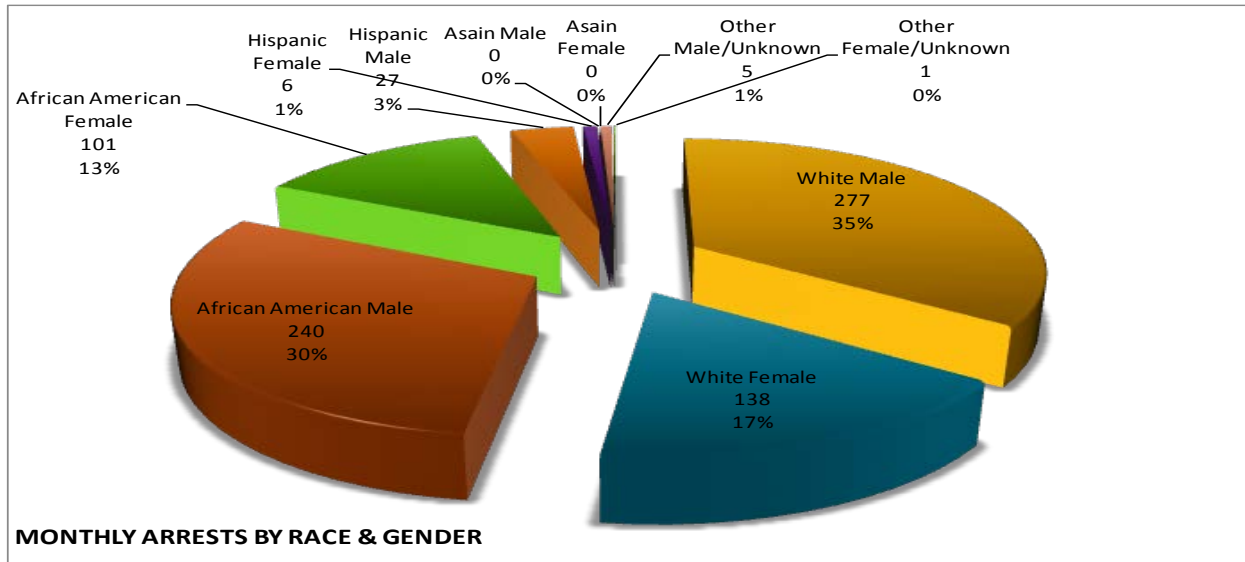
Caucasian males make up the majority, 35%, of arrestees this month ( $n = 277$ ). African American males make up 30% of arrestees for the month of March ( $n = 240$ ). Caucasian females make up 17% ( $n = 138$ ) and African American females make up 13% ( $n = 101$ ) of all

the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 3% ( $n = 27$ ), while Hispanic Females make up 1% of arestees this month ( $n = 6$ ). There were 5 Males (1%) amd 1 female of unknown race or ethnicity arrested in March.



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**EMERGENCY 911**

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible

for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

**UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION**

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and

work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

**PROWL**

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed

patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2<sup>nd</sup> Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

**WARRANTS**

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summonses, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for

transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.

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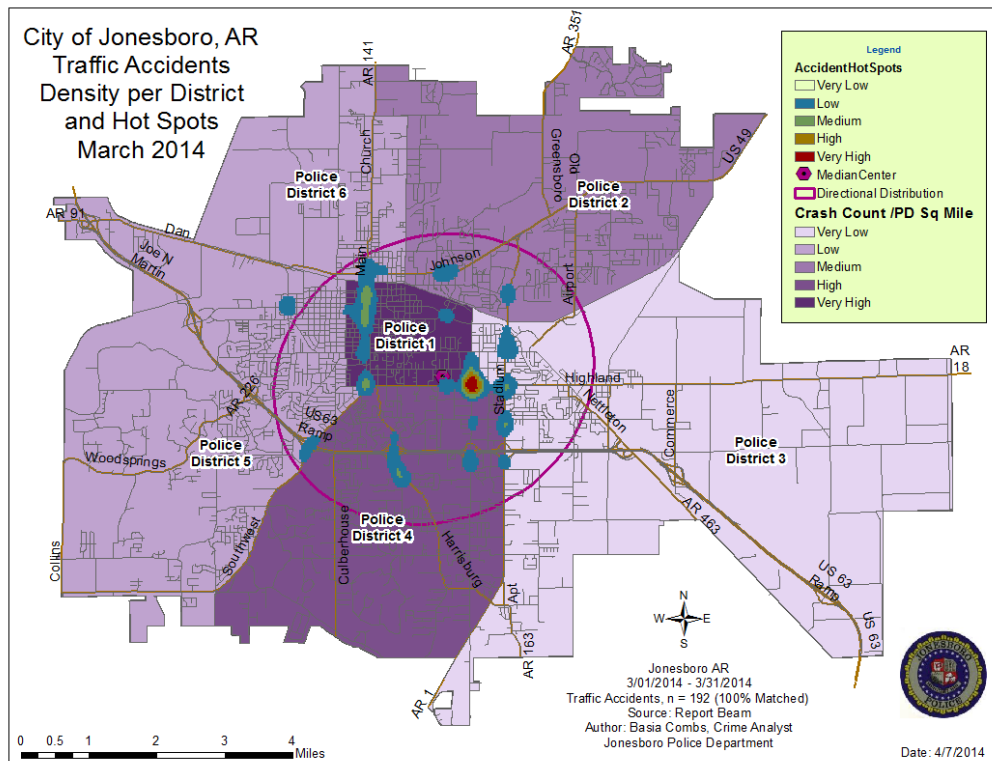
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**TRAFFIC**

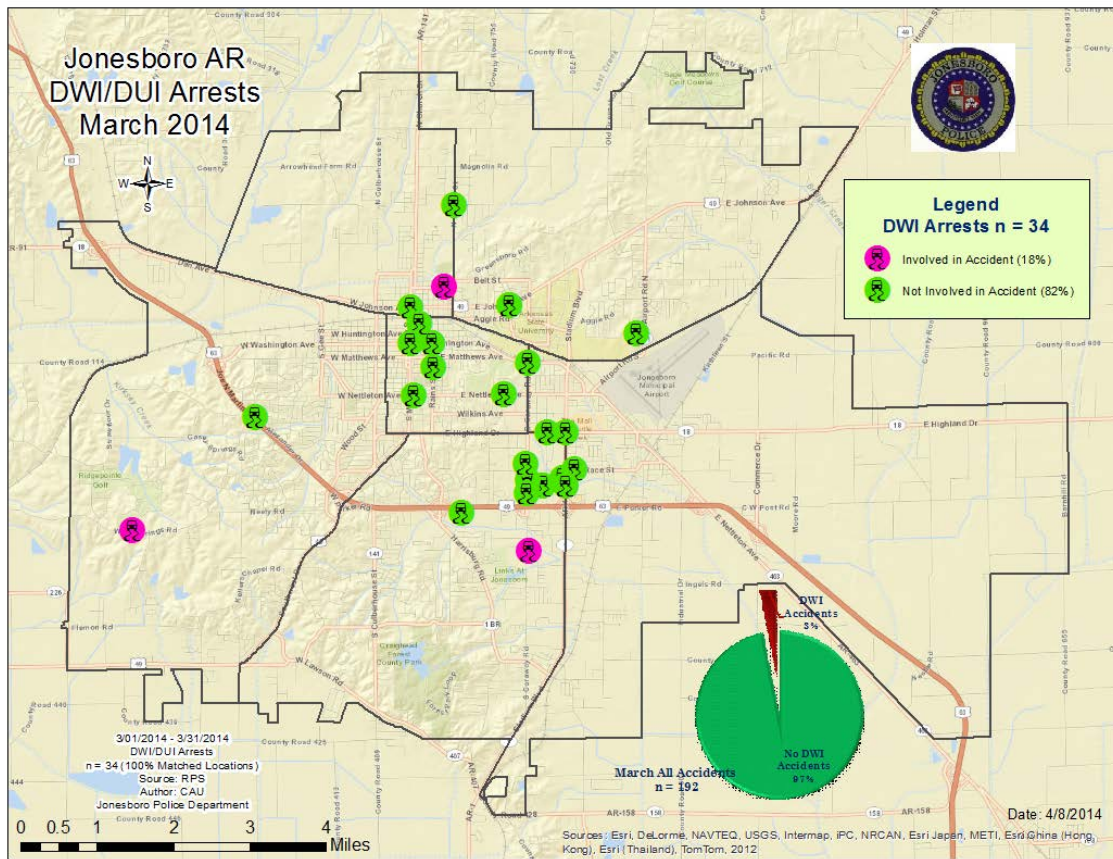
coverage for specific congestion problems and special events in the community. Last, they work details targeting specific issues, such as DWI enforcement and traffic safety checkpoints.
