The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision-making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

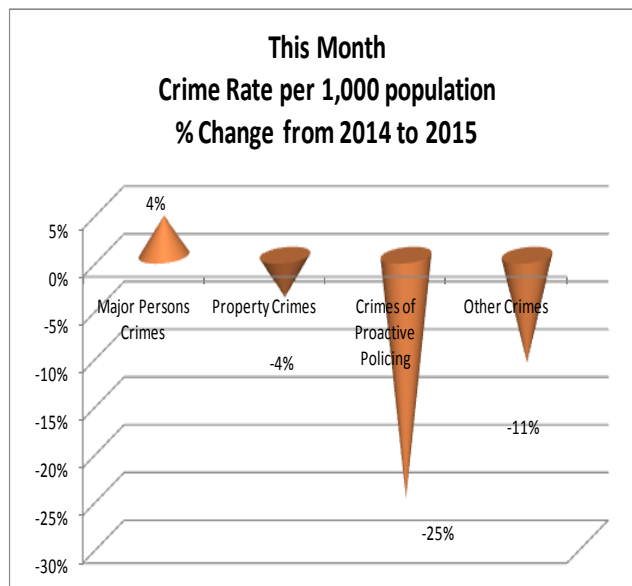
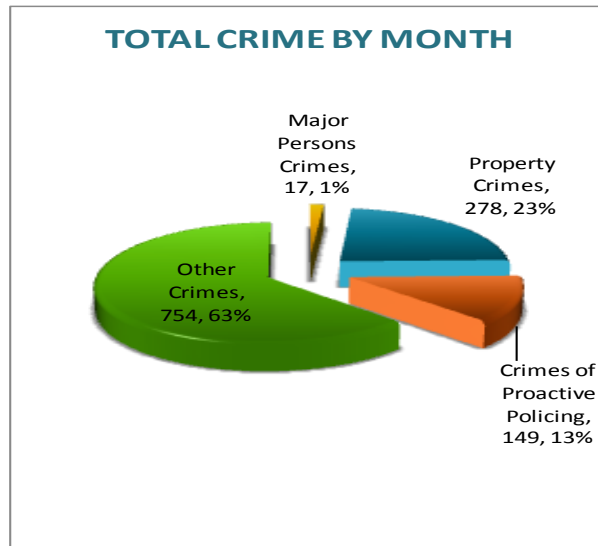
CRIME ANALYSIS

The Crime Analysis division consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Office is charged with providing the department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing, by administration for improved staffing decisions, and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into Total Crime, Crimes against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

TOTAL CRIME

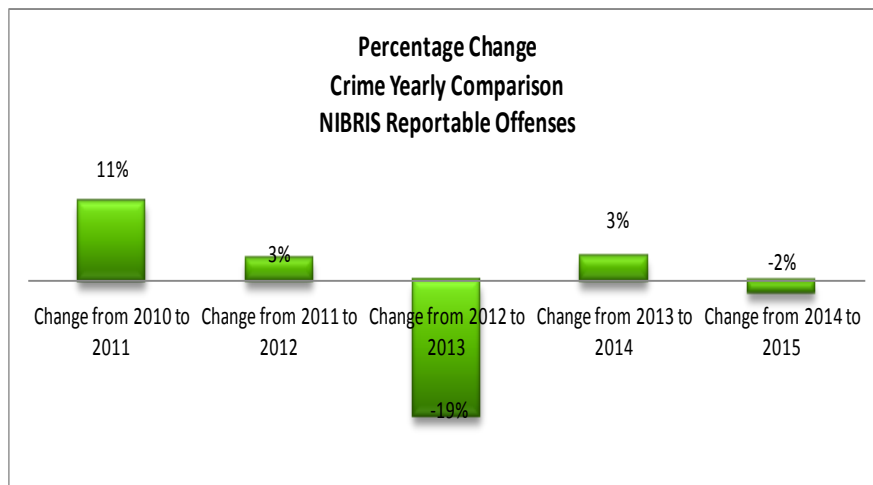
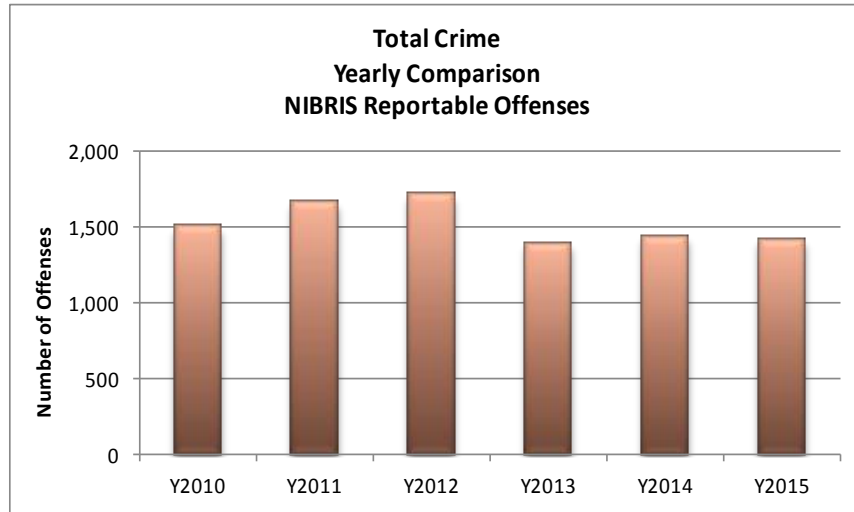
The crime activity for the month of February 2015 was at a total of 1,198 NIBRS reportable offenses, a -10% decrease, compared to the total of offenses reported in February of the last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in February of this year was at 16 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 19 crimes per 1,000 population last year¹, a - 12% decrease. As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 63%, of this month’s crime activity ($n = 754$). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 23% of all the crimes ($n = 278$). Following in third and fourth places are, respectively, Crimes of Proactive Policing, comprising of 13% ($n = 149$) of all the crimes, and Crimes against Persons, comprising of 1% ($n = 17$) of all the crimes this month.

The charts below depict frequencies of crime by year, percentage change from year to year, and year to date yearly comparison.

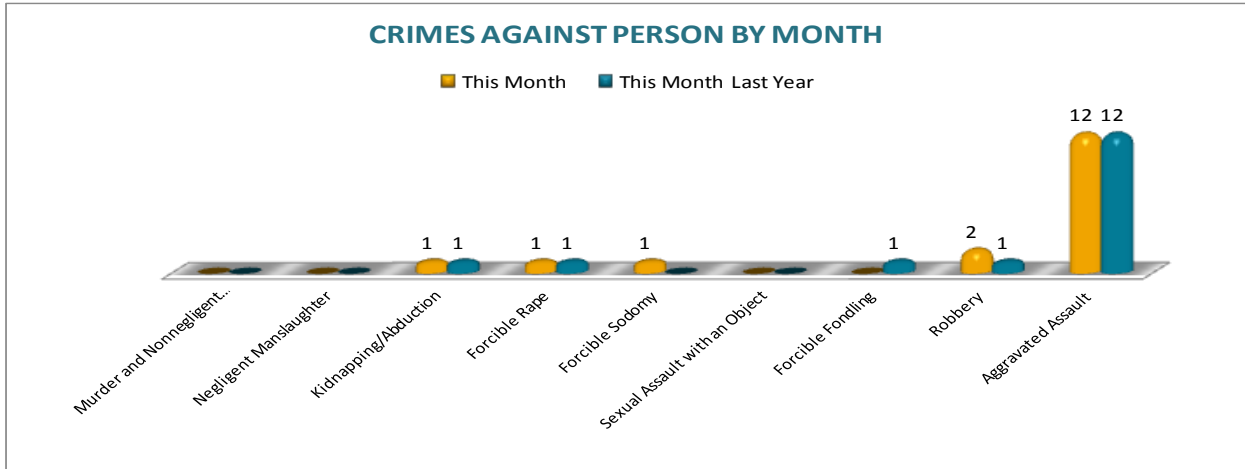


CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 crimes that make up this section. There were a total of 17 offenses in this area in February this year, 1 offense more, comparing to February of the last year. There was 1 more Forcible Sodomy reported this year in February,

comparing to the last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, there are no significant changes in frequencies for the remaining offenses under this category.

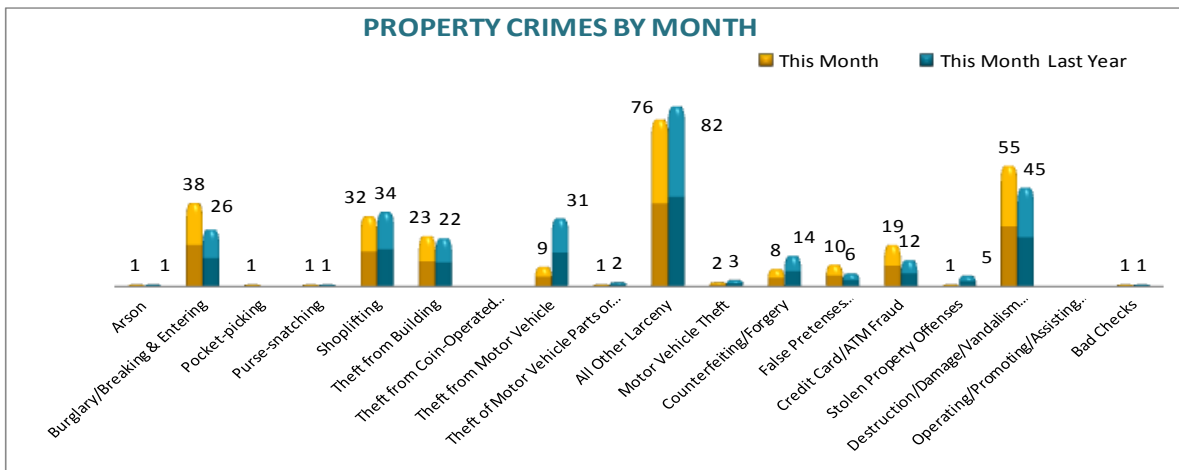

PROPERTY CRIMES

This section displays the criminal activity for 18 crimes, all against property. This month, there were a total of 278 Property Crimes, a -2% decrease, comparing to February of the last year. The data indicates change in Burglary/Breaking & Entering, up 46% (n= 38) compared to the 26 that took place this month last year, and in False Pretense/ Swindle/ Confidence games, up 67%. Credit card/ ATM

fraud has also increased, up 58%, however, the raw numbers report that there were 10 total incidents compared to the 6 of last year. Theft from Motor Vehicle has decreased, down -71%. Stolen Property Offenses have also decreased by -80%. No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.

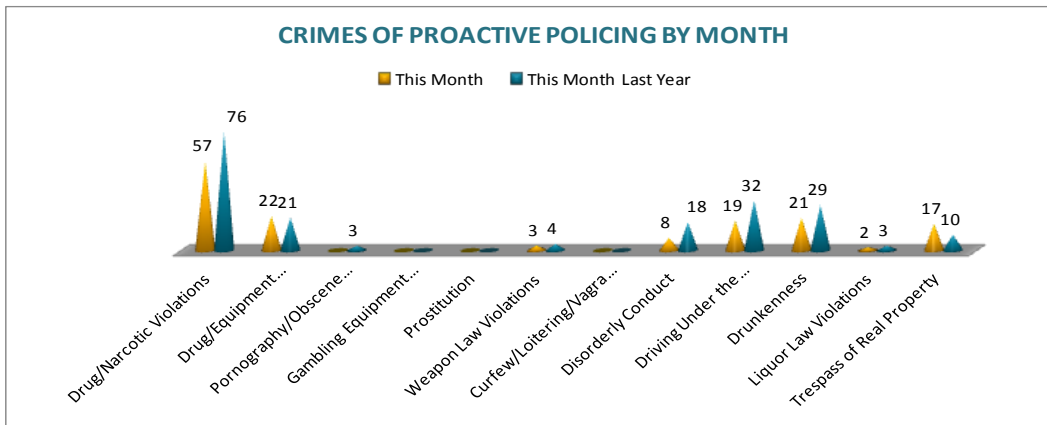

CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

Crimes of Proactive Policing are those crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 149 offenses have been reported this month, down -24%, comparing to February of the last year.

Drug/Narcotic Violations have decreased by -25%. Trespass of Real Property has increased by 70%. Driving under the Influence violations has decreased by -41%; Pornography/Obscene Material is down -100%. There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.



OTHER CRIMES

There are 21 crimes that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 754 Other Crimes reported, an -9% decrease, comparing to February of the last year. All Other Offenses have decreased by

-13%. Intimidation offenses have increased by 12% and Simple Assaults increased by 38%. Runaways (n= 8), have increased by 5 since this month last year. No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.

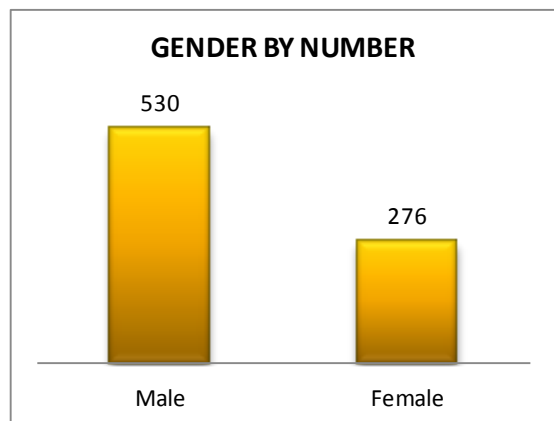
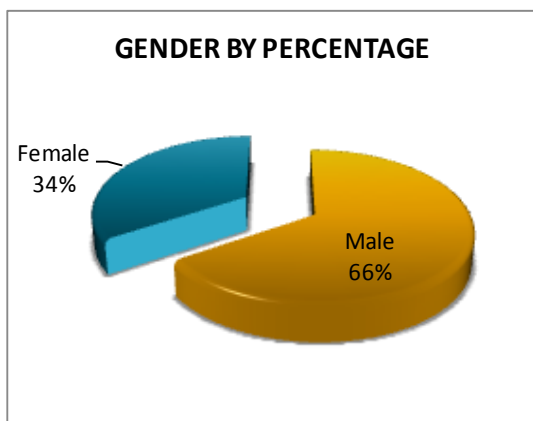

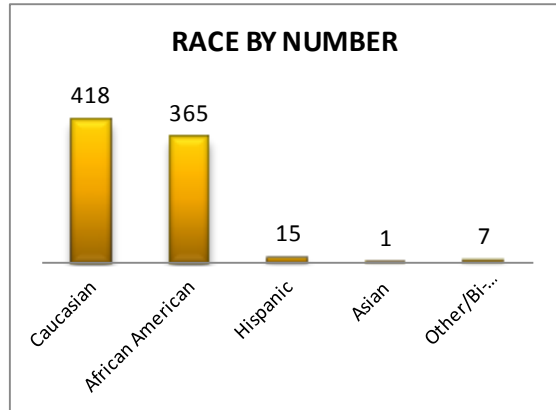
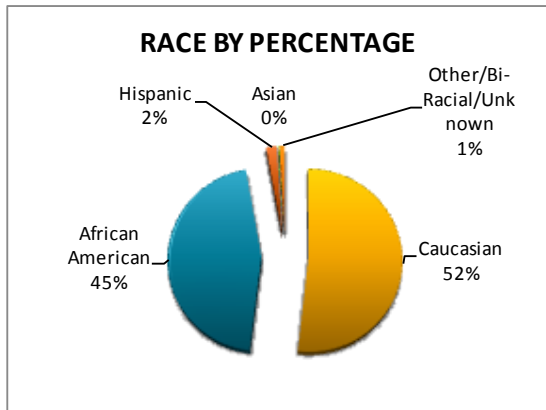
ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

In February 2015, there were a total of 806 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department, down -4%, comparing with the last year's data for the month of February. The rate of arrests per offense has increased by 6% this month, comparing to the rate from the previous year; this section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of

arrestees, 66%, have been male ($n = 530$), as opposed to 34% of female arrestees ($n = 276$). As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (52%) and African American (45%), comparing to Hispanic (2%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (1%).

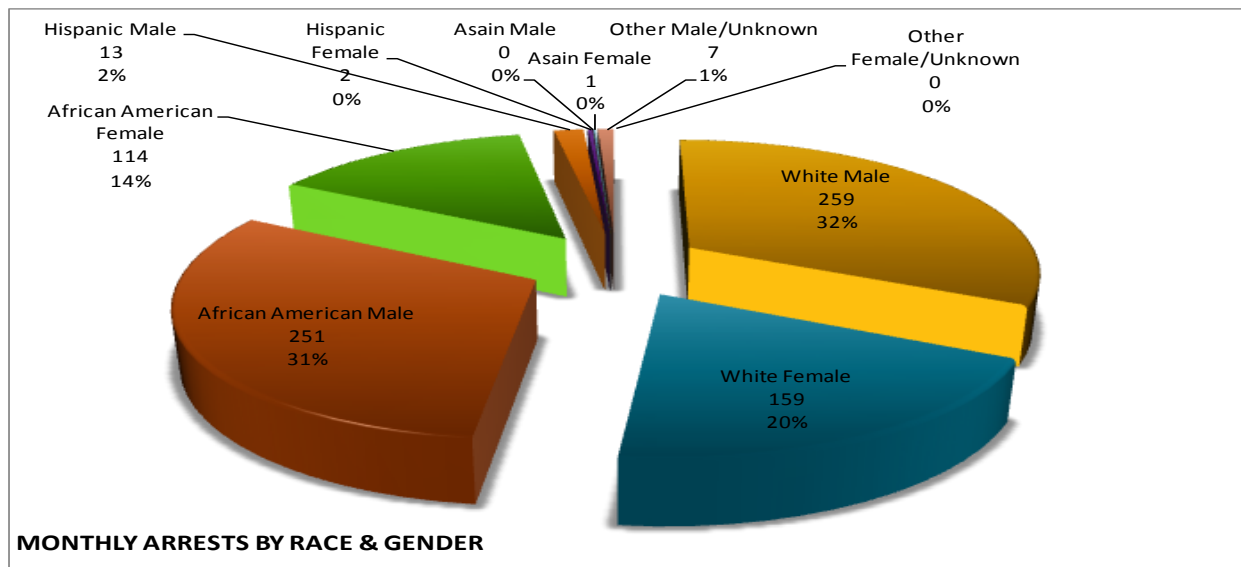

Caucasian males make up the majority, a 32% of arrestees this month, followed by, African American males 31%. Caucasian females make up 20% , while African American females make up 14% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic

males make up 2%, while Hispanic females, male of Other/Unknown race, and female of Other/Unknown race make up 1% or less of all the arrestees this month.



EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible

for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
