Monthly Report

May 2015

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The purpose of the Jonesboro Police Department Monthly Report is to compile data into one integrated report for review, allowing for a seamless flow of information for better decision making. After each department collates their monthly numbers and sends it to the Office of Crime Analysis, it is organized into sections of departmental data, analyzed and packaged, and finally disseminated to department heads, the Chief of Police, the City Mayor, and the City Council. Major sections include Crime Analysis, Emergency 911, Uniform Police Division, Prowl, Criminal Investigative Division, Warrants, Drug Task Force, Traffic, Animal Control, Fleet Maintenance, Records, and Professional Standards.

CRIME ANALYSIS

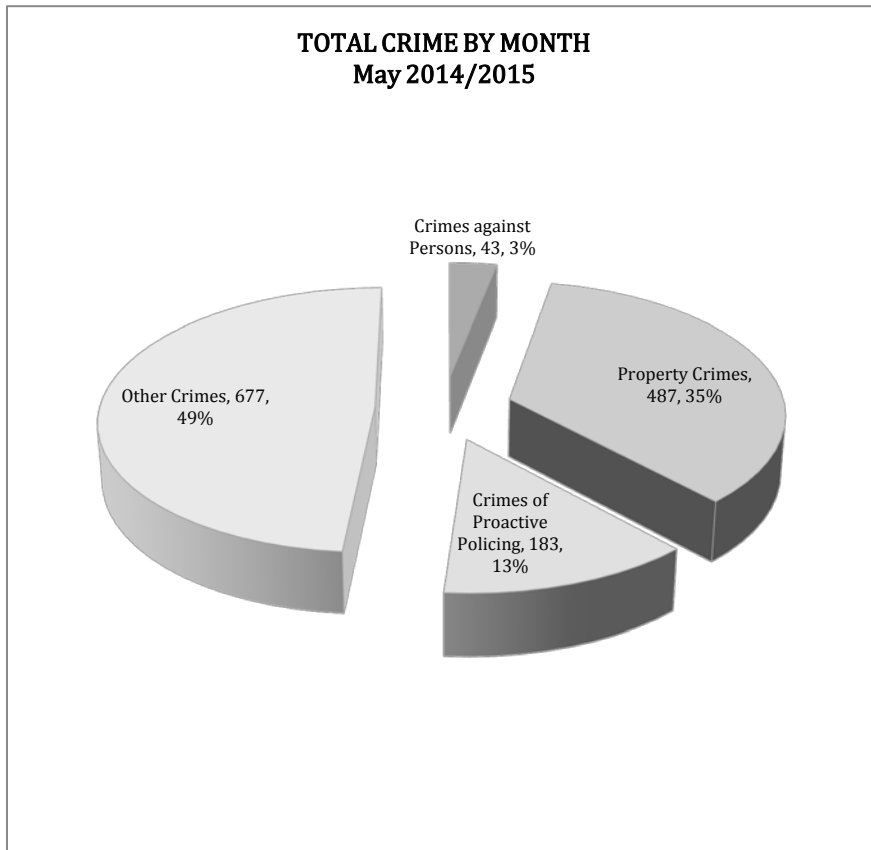
The Crime Analysis Unit consists of one Crime Analyst and one part-time Crime Analyst Assistant. The Crime Analyst position is responsible for the analysis and dissemination of crime activity data and the collection and maintenance of crime intelligence information for the city of Jonesboro. Additionally, the Crime Analyst is charged with providing the Jonesboro Police Department with current and accurate crime maps presenting crime activity data to audiences of interest and with responding to requests for crime data from civilians and departmental staff. Data exported from this division is used by field agents for more effective, efficient policing; by administration for improved staffing decisions; and by the Mayor's office for community decision making and enhanced public relations. The following section is broken down into: Total Crime, Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, Crimes of

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Proactive Policing, Other Crimes, Arrest Demographics, and Total Crime Monthly Comparison.

TOTAL CRIME

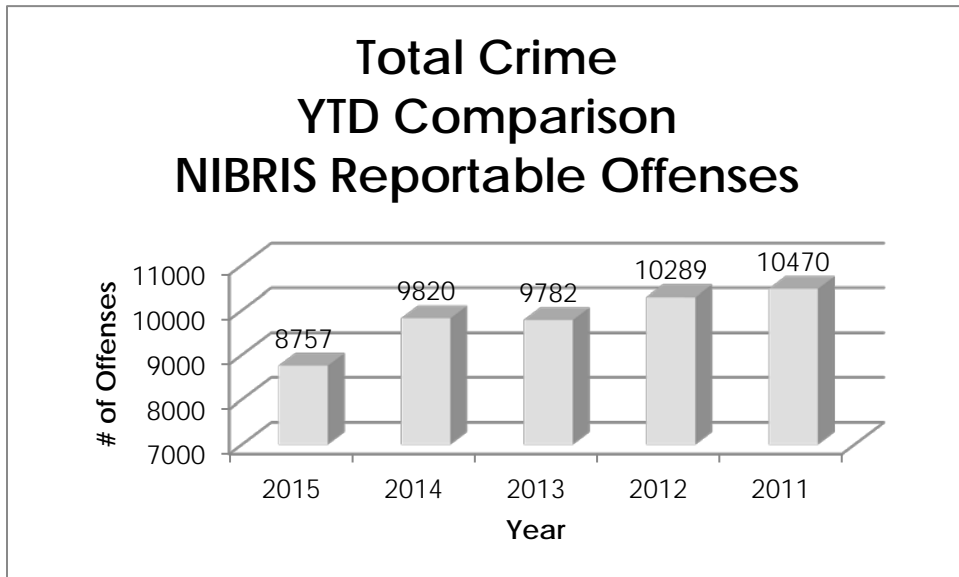
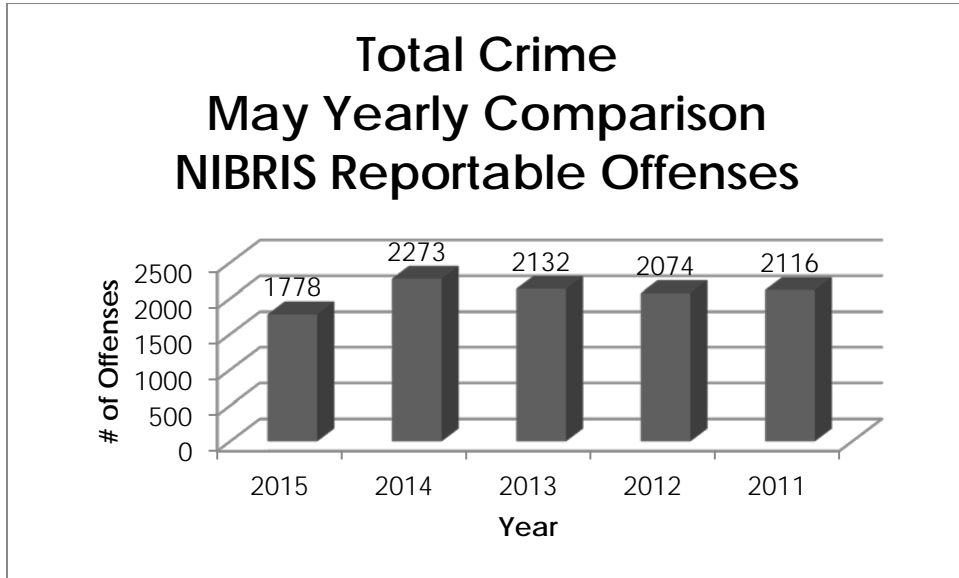
The crime activity for the month of May 2015 was at a total of 1,390 NIBRS reportable offenses, a 16% decrease compared to the total of offenses reported in May of last year. With Jonesboro population estimated to be equal to 72,958, the crime rate in May of this year was at 19 crimes per 1,000 population, compared to 23 crimes per 1,000 population last year.¹ As indicated on the pie chart below, Other Crimes absorb the majority, 49%, of this month's crime activity ($n = 677$). Property Crimes fall into a second place and comprise of 35% of all the crimes ($n = 487$). Crimes of Proactive Policing is comprised of 13% ($n = 183$) of all reported crimes, and Crimes against Persons is comprised of 3% ($n = 43$) of all reported crimes this month.



¹ Note: Population numbers are based on 2012 & 2013 population estimate, where 2012 population estimate is 70,187.

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The charts below depict the frequencies of crimes in the month of May from year to year, frequencies of crime by year, and a year to date annual comparison.



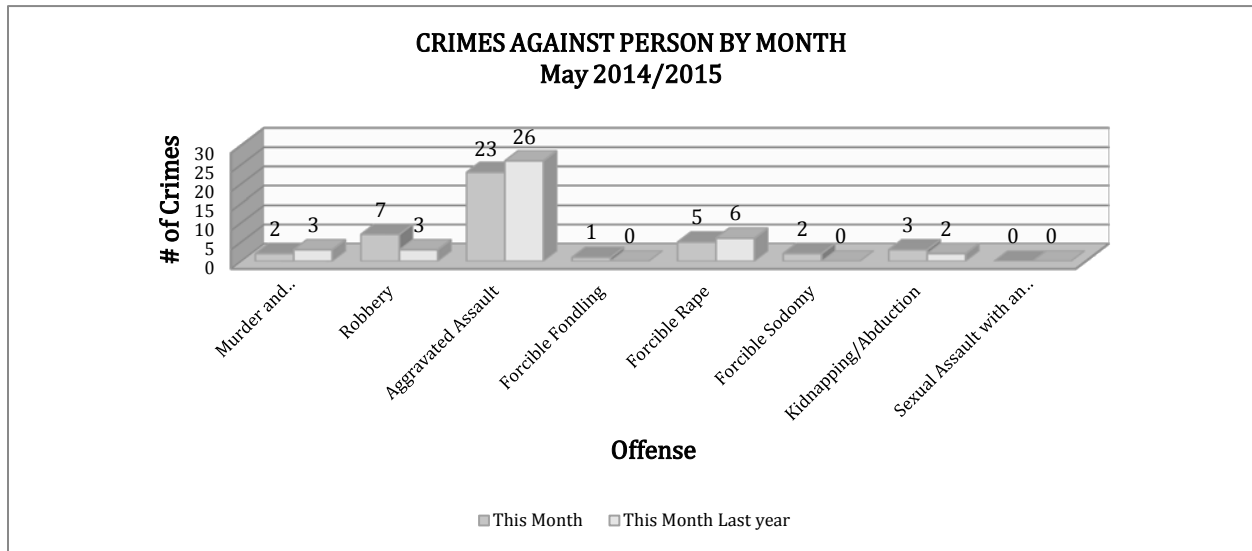
CRIMES AGAINST PERSONS

There are 9 NIBRIS offenses that make up this section. There were a total of 43 offenses in this area in May this year. There were 1 fewer forcible rapes reported this year in May compared to the last year. As demonstrated on the column chart below, the most

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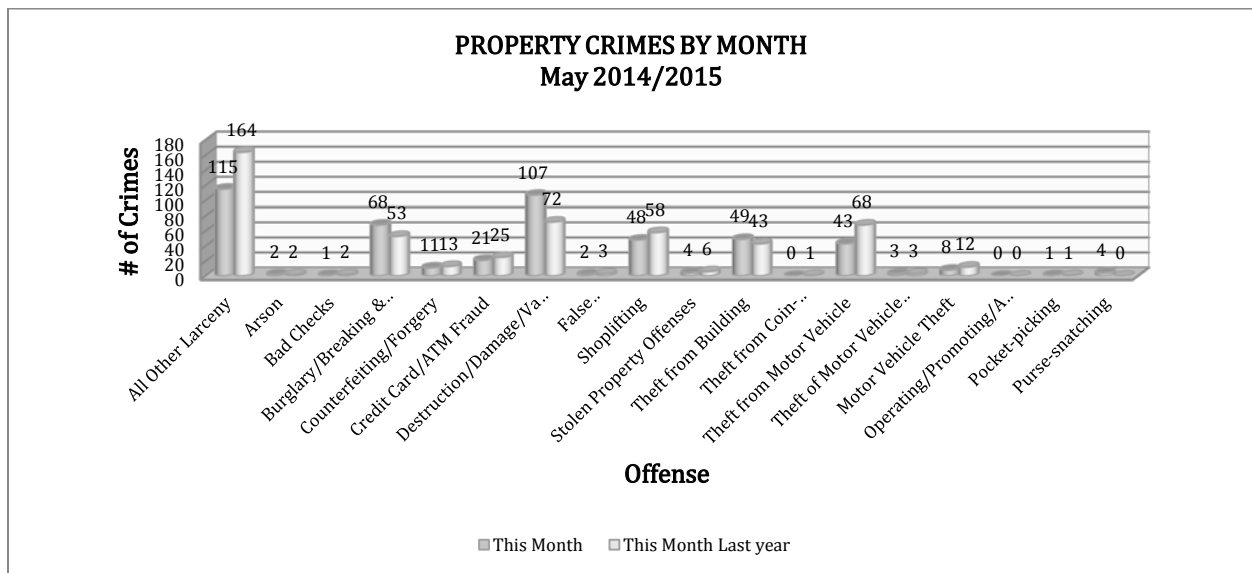
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significant change was in Robbery, with a net change of 4 more cases this year as compared to last year.



PROPERTY CRIMES

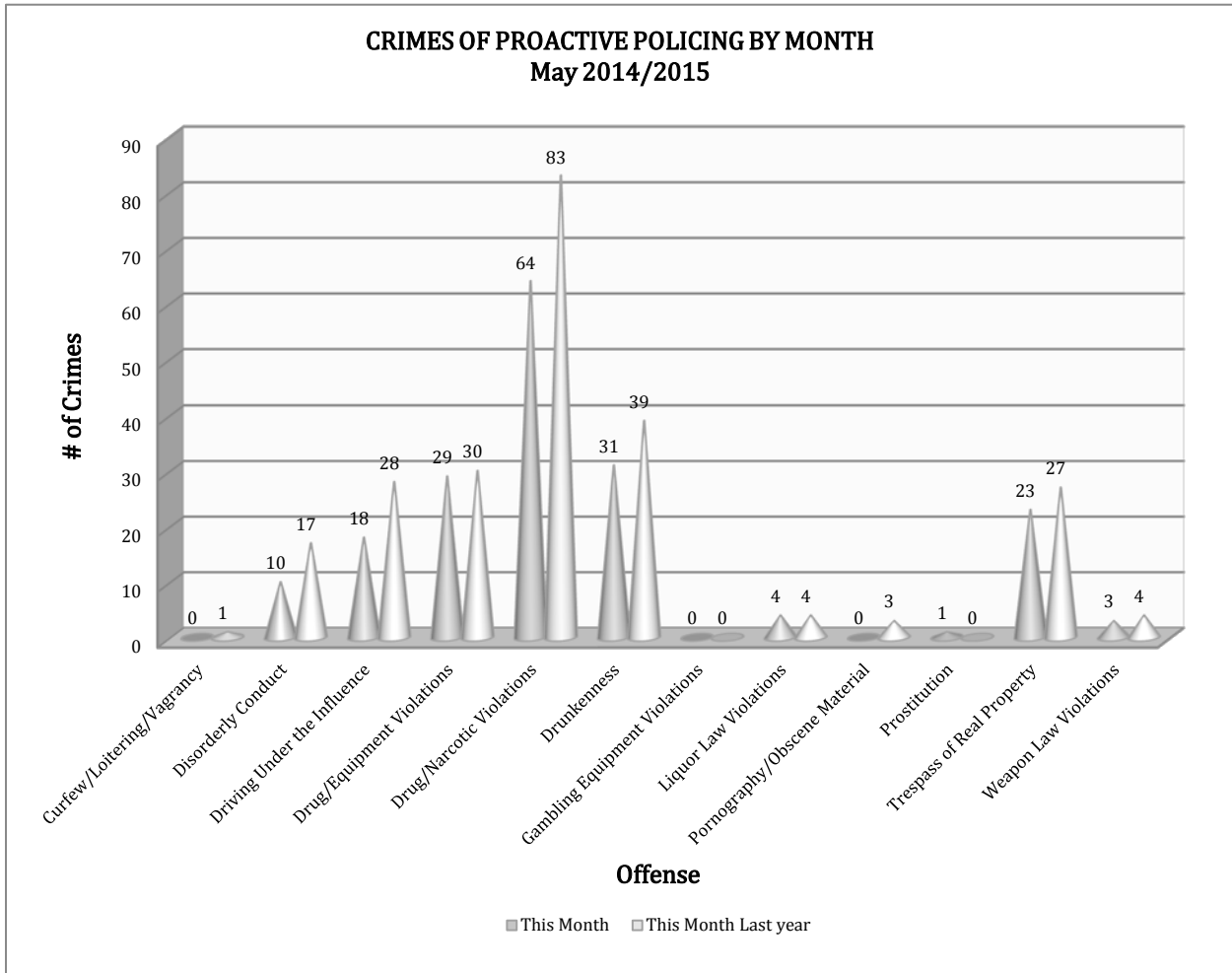
This section displays the criminal activity for property crimes. This month, there were a total of 487 Property Crimes, a 7% decrease, comparing to May of last year. The data indicates change in Burglary/Breaking & Entering, up 28% (n= 68) compared to the 53 that took place this month last year, and in Destruction/Damage/Vandalism of Property, up 49%. All Other Larceny has decreased 30%, dropping from 164 last year to 115 incidents this month. Theft from Motor Vehicle has also decreased, down 37% this year. No other significant changes are noted for the remainder of the offenses in this category of crimes.



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CRIMES OF PROACTIVE POLICING

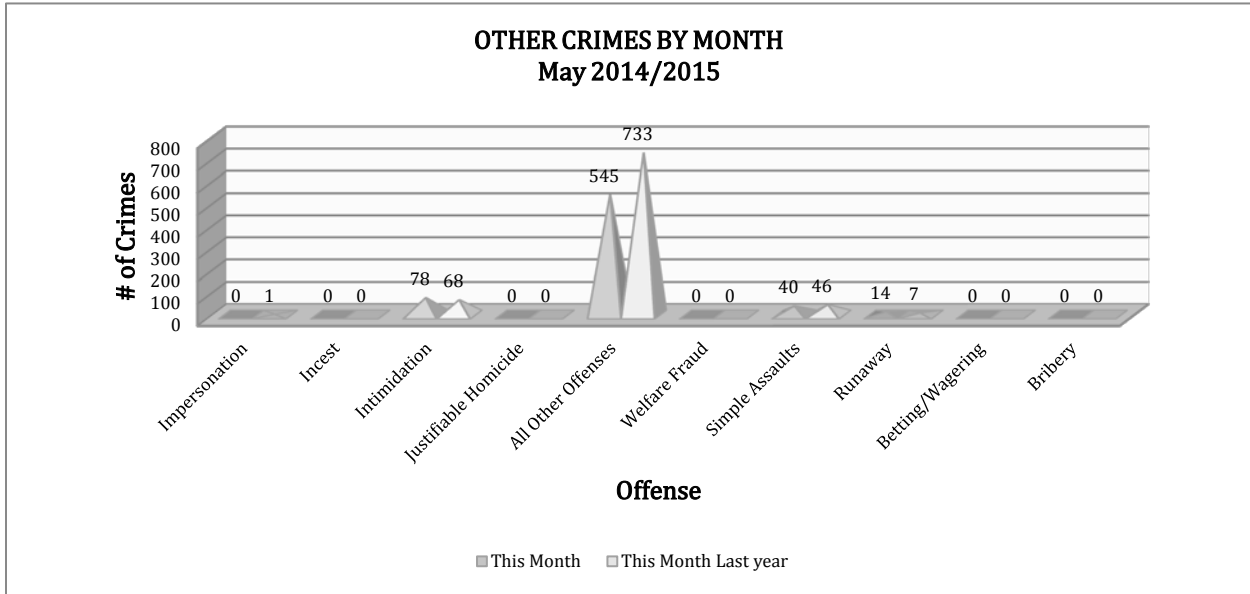
Crimes of Proactive Policing are crimes that result from police officers actively policing the streets to combat certain types of street crime. As chart below indicates, twelve crimes fall under this category. A total of 183 offenses have been reported this month, down 22%, compared to May of last year. Drug/Narcotic Violations have decreased by 23%. Trespass of Real Property has decreased by 15%. Driving under the Influence violations have decreased by 36%. There are no other major changes noted for the offenses in this category.



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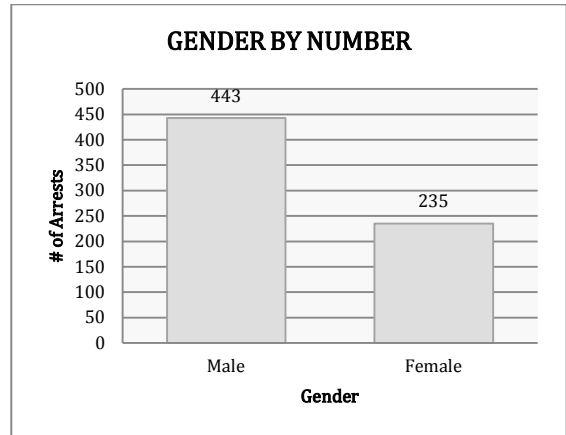
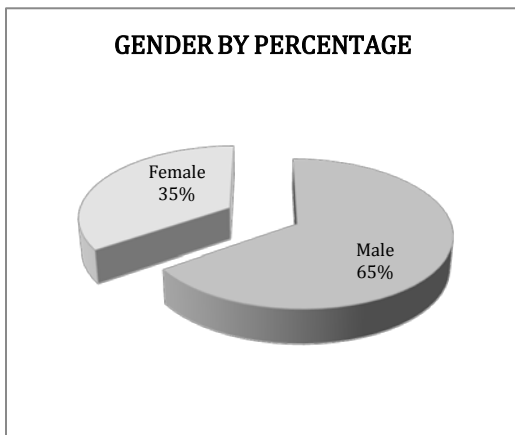
OTHER CRIMES

There are 10 offenses that fall into the Other Crimes category. This month, there have been a total of 677 Other Crimes reported, a 21% decrease, comparing to May of the last year. All Other Offenses have decreased by 26%. Simple Assaults decreased slightly by 13%. Runaways (n= 14), have increased by 7 incidents since this month last year. No other major changes are noted in this category of crimes this month.



ARREST DEMOGRAPHICS

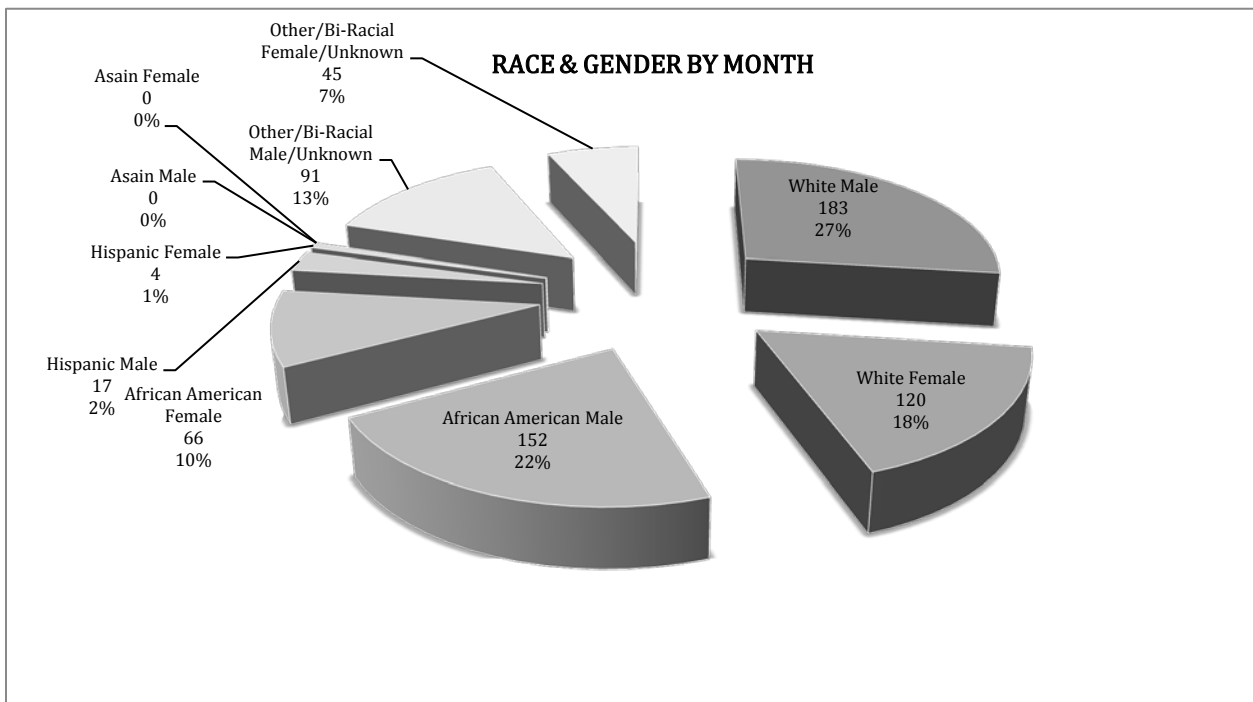
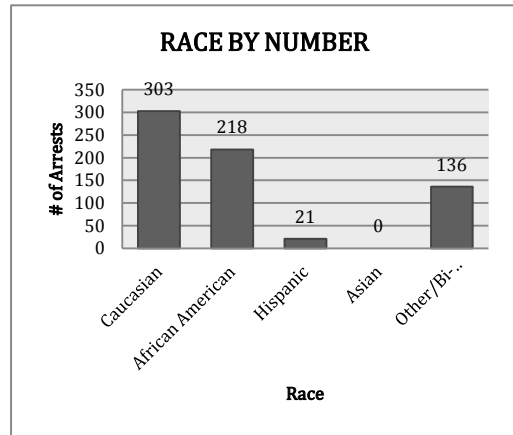
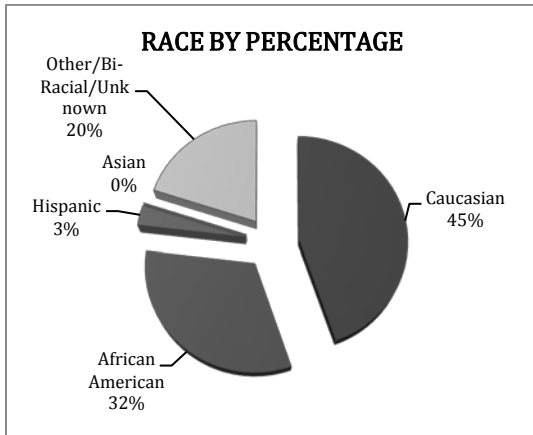
In May 2015, there were a total of 679 arrests carried out by the Jonesboro Police Department. This section breaks down this month's arrests by race and gender. The majority of arrestees, 59%, have been male (n= 398), as opposed to 41% of female arrestees (n= 281).



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As for the racial/ethnic composition, the majority of arrestees have been Caucasian (45%) and African American (32%), comparing to Hispanic (3%), Asian (0%), or other/unknown/bi-racial (20%). Caucasian males make up the majority, at 27% of arrestees this month, followed by, African American males 22%. Caucasian females make up 18% , while African American females make up 10% of all the arrestees this month. Hispanic males make up 2%, Other/Unknown race males represent 13% of arrestees, and female of Other/Unknown race make up for 7%, while Hispanic females, and there were no Asian males or females arrested this month.



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EMERGENCY 911

Also known as Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP), the Emergency 911 Division is responsible for answering all calls from public for emergency assistance, accessing the needed information to best assist, and then assigning the most efficient and effective emergency response. In addition, this division is responsible for setting priority call dispatching to field units including Police, Fire, and EMS. Emergency 911 also maintains all records for radio logs, calls for service, and other emergency service data collections.

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UNIFORM PATROL DIVISION

The UPD is responsible for responding to calls into the Emergency – 911 Division by civilians and are normally the first responders. Jonesboro is divided into 6 patrol districts. Officers from UPD are assigned to a district and work the same district every shift. In addition, when a Traffic Officer is not available, a UPD Officer will respond to traffic accidents and assist in directing traffic when necessary.

The Prowl unit is a uniformed street crimes unit specializing in criminal patrol, narcotics enforcement, gang investigation, and prostitution activity. The unit conducts directed patrols, investigates citizen complaints of street-level criminal activity, and directly assists the 2nd Judicial Drug Task Force. PROWL also assists any division within the Jonesboro Police Department at any time when needed.

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WARRANTS

The Warrants Division is responsible for serving warrants, criminal summons, and subpoenas that are issued by the District Court. On city court days, the Warrants Division provides a bailiff for court and a transport officer. In addition, this Division is responsible for transporting wanted persons arrested in other jurisdictions back to Jonesboro. The STEP program operates within this division and is a grant-funded operation in which officers can get paid overtime to enforce the safety belt law.
